Beware the Wild Children

To get a good sense of Los Angelesbased artist Georganne Deen's work, you need look no farther than the last line of the biography on her website, which reads, "Has two children: Gigi and Fairy Belle, both feral." Darkly comic and often grotesque, Deen's work, which will be on display at Stewart-Smith Gallery later this month, is a mixture of surrealism, pop culture, and cryptic text. Says curator Amy Stewart-Smith: "Deen's dark, disquieting and often riotous visual content rouses the shadowy passion teeming inside us."

Because of her cartoonish style and use of dream-logic, her paintings can seem childlike but her use of text suggests more mature concerns.

Same Sink, New Day

Janos Gat Gallery presents the first New York exhibition of Israeli-born artist Ra'anan Levy, Sinks and Spaces.

Levy's work feels both melancholy and obsessive. His drawings depict empty, often unfurnished, rooms and hallways from various angles at different times of day. His series of sinks shows a variety of homely, mostly steel, basins. Though his subjects are largely inert, viewed singularly, the pastels and sketches seem funereal and corpse-like, organic but rendered inanimate. Through repetition, however, Levy brings them to life. From canvas to canvas, perspectives and colors change, shapes shift, and the objects take on

moods.
