Glamour plus endurance equals feminism, or so one might conclude after viewing some of the work in this excellent show of videos by nine young women artists (including a pair of collaborative duos). Kate Gilmore lifts seventy-five-pound plaster blocks and Stanya Kahn goes at a hill in L.A. with a weed whacker—both while wearing high heels. Cathy Begien and Klara Liden add a dose of ambiguity and machismo to female representation, as does Shannon Plumb, with her Chaplinesque slapstick. The personal is satirically political in Wynne Greenwood and K8 Hardy's newscasts for a fictional television station ("WKRH: Pregnant with Information") and Jen DeNike offers a five-word critique of fairy-tale femininity—and a riff on Bob Dylan's famous sequence in "Don't Look Back"—shuffling cue cards that read "there are no happy endings."
